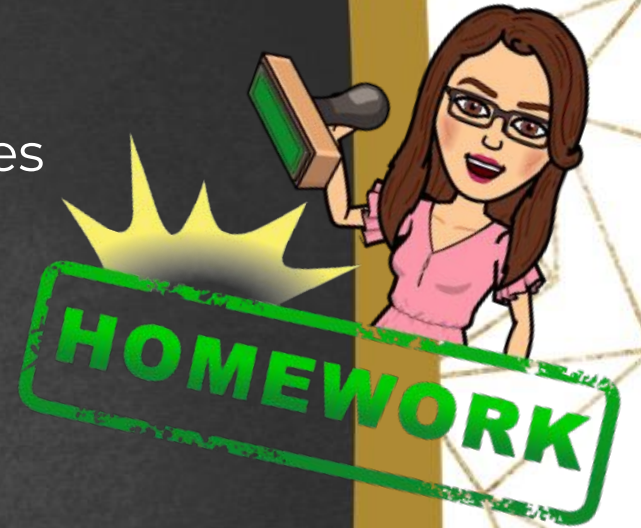

- *Fahrenheit 451* by Ray Bradbury (April)

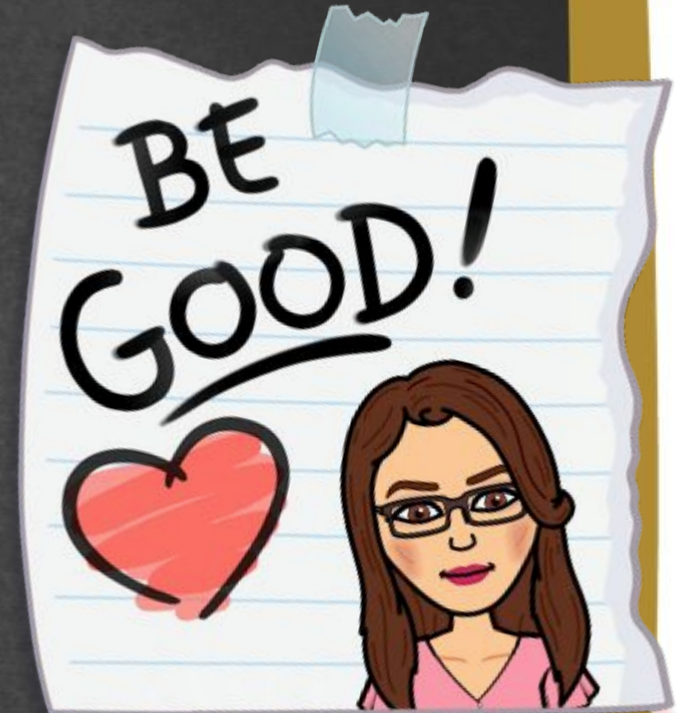
10th Grade Novels:

EXPECTATIONS

WORK

- DO YOUR WORK, without being told; you are in high school!

(I will not take the time to assess low quality work that you did not put time and effort into. You will get an automatic half credit or zero depending on the severity of low quality work.)
- Come to class prepared and focused every day. Make sure eat breakfast before school starts or have snacks readily available to eat during breaks!
- DON'T BE LAZY AND PRIORITIZE YOUR SCHOOLWORK!
- If you don't understand something, ASK ME OR A CLASSMATE FOR HELP. If you don't understand something because you didn't pay attention to the directions, use the Zoom chat to ask for clarification from your classmates. If many people don't understand, then that's on me, and I will re-explain.

Late Work Policy

- During Distance Learning only, students will be allowed to turn in late work within one week of the original due date. Late work will only be given up to 50% credit.
- Make sure to email Mrs. Chapman letting her know you've submitted late work on Google Classroom or else she may not know it's there!

Make-up Work/Quizzes/Tests Policy (occurring because of an absence):

- Students are responsible for inquiring about any assignments, readings, or class notes that were missed. Students should not ask during class about what they missed; students should ask a classmate and/or email the teacher so as to not fall behind.
- Any assignment that was due on the day of the absence will be due the day the student returns.
- Any assignment/quiz/test that was assigned or taken on the day the student was absent will be due **WITHIN ONE WEEK OF THE ABSENCE**, otherwise the assignment will become a zero in the grade book. Students should attend tutoring to make up missed tests/quizzes.

PARTICIPATION

Active Participation:

- All students are expected to participate fully in class. Students are expected to work in pairs, small groups, and individually. Class will be interactive and will require student preparation through assigned readings, notes, critical thinking, discussions, and collaborative projects. Students will be assessed on their knowledge displayed through their academic participation and social participation skills. We will work on developing collaboration skills throughout the year.

Restroom/Exiting the Zoom Policy:

- Students' cameras must remain on during class time, unless the teacher has given special directions. Students should privately Zoom message Mrs. Chapman letting her know they are leaving to use the restroom. Students are encouraged to use the restroom before school, during "brain breaks" given, and during "passing periods".

- **IF YOUR EMAIL IS NOT UP TO PAR, I WILL ASK YOU TO EDIT AND RESEND YOUR EMAIL CORRECTLY BEFORE I RESPOND TO IT.**
